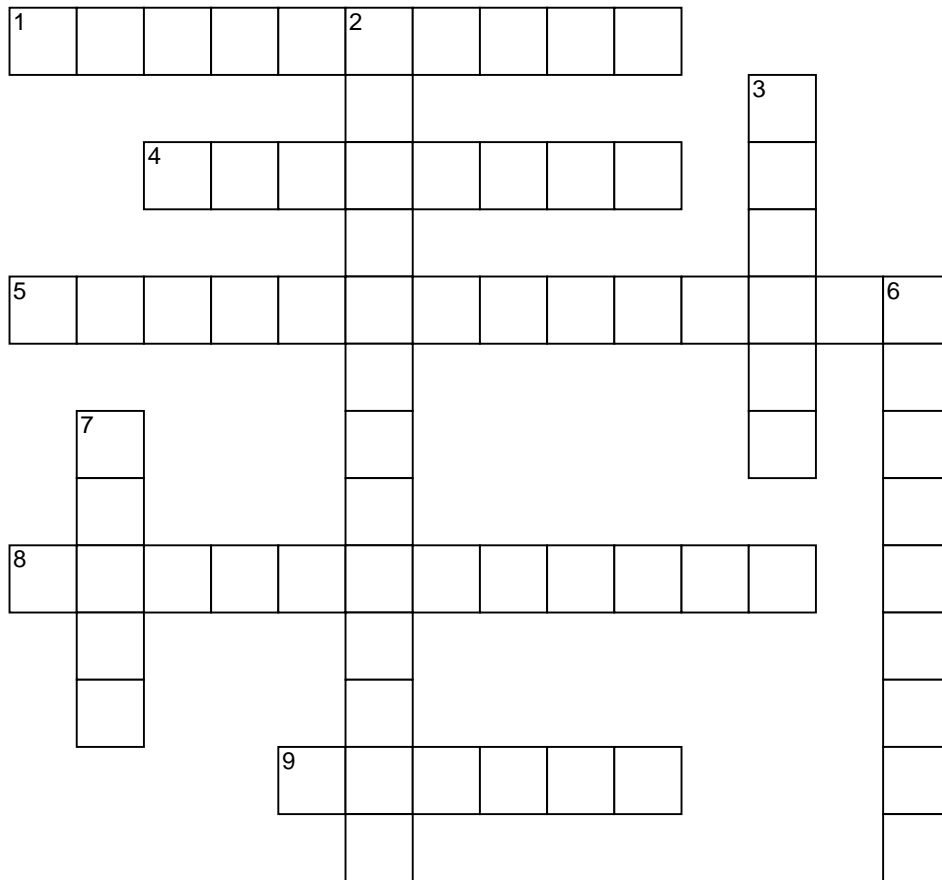

- 5 Increased relocation of welfare provision away from the family and into the activities of the state
- 8 A focus on the family as the traditional institution and welfare provider
- 9 Often presented in a nuclear form but there is greater variety in society
